PACKAGE A: Basic Tracking	8 a.m. – 5 p.m.	**	Basic search and rescue techniques, psychological factors of lost victims, tracking and reading signs, working with mounted search teams. Includes field exercises.	8
PACKAGE B: Advanced Tracking and Wilderness Rescue	8 a.m. – 5 p.m.	**	Advanced search and rescue techniques when working in a wilderness environment, victim care, tracking and reading signs. Includes field exercises	8
PACKAGE C: Command and Communications in a Search and Rescue Incident	8 a.m. – 5 p.m.		Covers basic communications needs and setting up a rescue/search operation from the command and control standpoint	8
PACKAGE D: Pump Operations	8 a.m. – 5 p.m.	*	Operation of fire apparatus pumps, drafting and water distribution	8
PACKAGE E: Patient Packaging	8 a.m. – 5 p.m.		Covers emergency care of patients involved in vehicle crashes to prepare them for transport via ambulance or helicopter.	8
PACKAGE F: HazMat Awareness and NFA Recognition and Identification of Hazardous Materials	8 a.m. – 5 p.m.		An introduction to recognizing and identifying hazardous materials using the DOT Emergency Response Guidebook, HazMat transport and fixed location and emergency procedures. Students will also receive a certificate for the NFA course Recognizing and Identifying Hazardous Materials.	8
PACKAGE G: Basic Auto Extrication	8 a.m. – 5 p.m.	*	Use of basic hand and power extrication tools	8

*\*PPE / SCBA must be NFPA-approved. Full bunker gear including helmet with faceshield or NFPA-approved goggles, safety glasses, gloves and boots.*

*\*\*Students in Packages A and B should wear any gear suitable for heavy brush (no camo or bunker gear or western-style boots). Students should bring a light-weight helmet with chinstrap, eye protection, sunscreen, gloves, rugged footwear, highly visible clothing. A recommended personal equipment pack containing flat-faced compass, GPS units and instruction manual, small personal first aid kit, canteen, water bottle or camelback, duct tape or moleskin for prevention of blisters. Wildland firefighting gear is suitable. Other useful equipment would be radios which have Mutual Aid channels A-B-C, rain gear and insect repellent.*
